The 1998 jubilee coins

The two jubilee coins to be issued in 1998 reproduce both the old and new silver mintings. The «200th anniversary of the Helvetic Republic» coin reproduces in a square frame a 40-batzen piece of 1789, depicting a cadet from the Helvetic period. The «150th anniversary of the Swiss Federal Constitution» coin originates from a 5-franc piece of 1850, portraying the famous seated Helvetia in a similar frame. The tails side of both coins are the same, showing 25

pictograms in the form of the Swiss cross in a sqare frame - a symbol of the solidarity of peoples.

200th anniversary of the Helvetic Republic


Following the collapse of the Ancien Régime, the Helvetic Constitution in 1798 laid the foundation stone of a democratic and liberal political and social system. The Acte de Médiation of Napoleon I suppressed a large number of the reforms introduced with the Helvetic Republic. However, many of the ideas realised during that period were taken over in the 1848 Federal Constitution.

150th anniversary of the Swiss Federal Constitution

The Sonderbund war and the establishment of the 1948 Swiss Federal Constitution ushered in a new era in Swiss history. The Federal Constitution with its bicameral system comprising the Council of States and the National Council still forms the legal basis of the modern Swiss state. It underwent a total revision in 1874 - the only one since its inception.

The Artist

The artist Werner Jeker was born 1944 in Mümliswil SO. Studies at the arts-andcrafts school in Lucerne and a formative period established him as a graphic artist. Member of the Alliance Graphique Internationale (AGI). Various exhibitions and awards at home and abroad: 1988: New York «Award for exceptional use of Photography in Graphic Design», 1989: Swiss National Bank, winner of the competition for the new series of banknotes, 1991: «Grand Prix des Arts appliqués». His lithographics were also acquired by the Museum of Modern Art in New York.
