The coin

The main motif on the face is an angel, offering the message of peace to the group of persons facing her. To the right is the Latin inscription «PAX IN TERRA», meaning «peace on earth».

The reverse continues the theme on the face via an olive branch - the sign of peace. The flowing diagonal of the branch separates the circular surface area into two zones. To the upper right there is the year «ANNO DOMINI 2000», and below, the designation «HELVETIA» and the nominal value, «FR 20».

Since 1936, the Swiss Confederation has been issuing commemorative coins to mark significant historical and cultural events, or to honour outstanding personalities. Tribute is also paid to typical aspects of Swiss culture.

True to tradition, the commemorative coins are the work of Swiss artists. In collaboration with the Federal Department for Culture, 'swissmint' allocates the commissions and holds design competitions.

These special coins will bear a legal tender value and will be minted in a limited run. The Confederation will use the net profit from the sale of these commemorative coins to promote cultural projects in Switzerland.

The artist

Roman Candio was born in Murgenthal, Canton of Aargau, in 1935 and grew up in Fulenbach, Canton of Solothurn. After completing teacher training in Solothurn, he taught as a primary school teacher from 1955 until 1958 before turning to a career in art. He attended the Lucerne School of Art from 1958 until 1959 and then from 1959 until 1960 the State Academy of Art in Düsseldorf, Subsequently, he assisted the church painter Ferdinand Gehr to create major wall and ceiling paintings. After study periods in Italy, he has lived in Solothurn since 1961, where he works in the fields of painting, drawing and sculpture. Among others, he has created works for public buildings (window, wall and ceiling paintings, tapestries and reliefs for churches, hospitals, administrative buildings and schools). In 1968, Roman Candio received the Canton of Solothurn Promotional Award. In 1991, he was awarded the Canton of Solothurn Arts Prize for his creative painting and his work in the field of «art and buildings». He has held various individual and collective exhibitions in Switzerland and abroad.
