Official Swiss commemorative coin

The first Swiss commemorative coin was minted in 1936. Since 1974 the Confederation issues yearly one commemorative coin with a contemporary topic in two versions: uncirculated (standard coinage) and proof-quality (especially for coin collectors).

These coins are the creations of Swiss artists. The Federal Administration of Finances in co-operation with the Federal Office of Culture performs competitions of fine arts or places corresponding individual orders.

The net profits resulting from the sales of the series are appointed to support Swiss cultural projects by means of lump sum payments.

Peter Emch was born 1945 in Bienne. After completing his studies at the arts-and-crafts school he left Bienne and worked as a graphic artist in Paris and Zurich. Due to a scolarship awarded by the municipality of Zurich he was able to spend a formative period in New York.

Since 1980 Peter Emch teaches at the arts-and-crafts school in Zurich.

In various notable exhibitions throughout Europe and America his creations specifically drawings, wood-engravings and oil-paintings roused a great interest.





The series

The commemorative coins HELVE-TICA from 1994 to 1996 are dedicated to the set topic "Landscapes and Legends". The third coin of this four-piece set for coin collectors and art-lovers is dedicated to "The Giant Gargantua".



The artist Peter Emch not only evokes memories of the past with his four fabulous creatures dominating typical Swiss landscapes but also gives an original contribution to the renaissance of Swiss mythology.



The four-piece set in proof-quality will be issued 1996 in short supply (5000 sets). Availability from summer 1995.
